FISH POND AND SOLAR ARRAY

The meandering landscape of the pond environs has proven to be a centerpiece of the Garden. Beautifully enriched by the natural bog plantings, floating plants, and especially the large goldfish and koi enhance the Garden's ability to delight and educate local schoolchildren and community members. RING volunteers designed and installed six underground watering systems and the solar-powered water circulation system to include seven pools and a waterfall. You can learn all about it and become an apprentice to our director of projects.

OPEN HOURS AND EVENTS

The RING Garden is open to the public, weather permitting, in 2006 on Tuesday, Thursday and Friday evenings, and Saturday mornings; seasonal weather affords the Garden to be opened during the rest of the year, as well. 
Potluck dinners, poetry readings, member meetings, and musical entertainment are scheduled at various times, and we invite members to propose and sponsor additional events.
